



name is Brahman. Those who are not able to recognise this truth can never experience true happiness in life.

Embodiments of Love!

Love is the other name of Brahman, Call it love, Atma, Prema, Aham, Brahman, all have the same meaning. Nothing else is seen in this world except love. But we do not understand the true meaning of love. We identify it with worldly and physical relationships. But physical relationships do not connote true love. Real love is that which is ever true. You are not one person but three: the one you think you are; the one others think you are; the one you really are. What others think about you is just their imagination. Your Self is your reality. What does Self mean? It means 'I'. This 'I' is universal and is uniformly present in everybody. However, you can experience this unity only when you cross your little individual 'I' of ego. This is the inner meaning of cross which is worshipped by the Christians. All are one. Nobody is separate from you or against you. You should always treasure this truth in your heart.

All that is born out of Karma and sustained by it is imaginary and ephemeral. As I have told you earlier, you are the embodiments of Brahman. You can realise truth only when you consider yourself as Brahman. So long as you don't recognise this truth, you identify yourself with the name given to you by your parents such as Ramanna, Krishnanna. All these names have been given to you by your parents just for the sake of identification. You are not born with these names. What is the name that you are born with? You do not know this. Suppose one goes to the parents of a new-born child and asks, "What is the name that you have given to this child?" They may say, "We have not yet given any name to the child." There are billions of people in the world. But none of them seems to have realised the truth that he is essentially divine. People identify themselves by the names given to them by their parents. But they do not know their real name. They do not know the name they are born with. Therefore, they identify themselves with the names given to them and lead a worldly life. The true name of man is one that he is born with and that is Atma. That is Brahman. What is the meaning of Brahman? It means you only. Brahman has no birth or death. Only when you understand this truth can you know your reality.

How do things come into existence? They are created by will power (Here Swami materialised a gold chain and said that He willed it). This is born out of My Will and did not exist earlier. Everything is born out of Divine Will. God is the cause of Maya. The entire creation is the result of the combination of Maya and God. There can be no creation without Maya. Therefore, Maya follows every person like his shadow. We lead our lives under the influence of Maya. It does not leave us like our shadow. It is the cause of all our delusion. When the sun rises, our shadow is very long. When the sun is right on our head, the shadow falls under our feet. Hence, it increases and decreases. Therefore, we should not make shadow as the basis of our lives.

Every being is born out of Brahma Sankalpa (Divine Will). Without God, there can be no creation. During the summer season, land looks bare without any vegetation. But when there is rainfall, so many plants come out of it. Wherefrom do all these come? They come from rain. Wherefrom does the rain come? It comes from the clouds. Wherefrom the clouds come? 

Grand Christmas Celebrations

HOLY FESTIVAL OF Christmas was celebrated on a grand scale in a most sacred manner at Prasanthi Nilayam in the Divine Presence of Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. The entire Prasanthi Nilayam complex bore a festive look with traditional Christmas decorations on this occasion. All the temples, office buildings and canteens in the complex were beautifully decorated with flowers, Christmas trees, stars and many other decorations. Fabulous decorations were done at the residence of Bhagavan and Sai Kulwant Hall, the venue of the celebrations. At night, decorative lights on all the main buildings presented an enchanting look.

The festivities spanning four days began on the afternoon of 24th December 2007. 35 small children welcomed Bhagavan into Sai Kulwant Hall with floral offerings when He came to the Hall at 4.35 p.m. The programme began after Bhagavan's Darshan in Sai Kulwant Hall at 4.50 p.m. amidst chanting of sacred Vedic hymns by the students of Sri Sathya Sai University. The first item of the programme was presented by the children's choir comprising 56 boys and 57 girls. They began their programme with chanting of Sanskrit verses from the 18th chapter of Bhagavadgita, signifying the underlying unity of all creation. This was followed by singing of Christmas carols. Beginning with a sacred prayer to Bhagavan in Sanskrit followed by

its translation in English verse, the children captivated all hearts by their melodious singing with the accompaniment of sweet music. They concluded their programme with joyous singing of "jingle bells ..." accompanied by distribution of chocolates by four boys dressed as Santa Claus among devotees in jam-packed Sai Kulwant Hall. Next to enthrall the devotees in Sai Kulwant Hall was the adults choir comprising about 750 ladies and gents from 51 countries. There were 38 musicians in the choir playing

guitars, violins, viola, cello, flute, saxophone, trumpet, keyboards percussion instruments. and Beginning with traditional Sanskrit prayer to Lord Ganesh, the choir presented in all eleven beautiful Christmas carols with deep devotion and dedication. ΑII the compositions were meaningfully worded and excellently rendered in the true Christmas spirit which suffused the entire milieu and filled each heart with ecstasy. Carol singing which started at 5.00 p.m.

came to a close at 6.00 p.m. This was followed by Bhajans which were also led by overseas devotees. The programme came to a close with Arati to Bhagavan at 6.15 p.m.

On Christmas morning, i.e., 25th December 2007, Bhagavan came to Sai Kulwant Hall at 8.15 a.m. amidst chanting of Vedic hymns by the university students. After showering the bliss of His Divine Darshan on the mammoth gathering of devotees in the Hall, Bhagavan came to the verandah, cut the cakes placed there and lighted candles on them amidst joyous cheers of the devotees.

The first item of the programme was violin recital by the students of Sri Sathya Sai Primary School, Prasanthi Nilayam. They played many Christmas carols, devotional songs and Bhajans on their violins to the delight of listeners in Sai Kulwant Hall and concluded it with the playing of "jingle bells ..." during which many students dressed as Santa Claus came to Bhagavan with bagfuls of chocolates, received His blessings and distributed them among the students and devotees.

After this, the students sang Christmas carols accompanied by appropriate commentary, singing the glory of Jesus and expressing their love and devotion to Bhagavan. The morning programme concluded with Arati to Bhagavan at 9.40 a.m.

On the afternoon of 25th December, Bhagavan came to Sai Kulwant Hall at 5.15 p.m. and showered the bliss of His Darshan on the yearning devotees on this auspicious day. Soon after Bhagavan's Darshan, Sri John Behner, the coordinator of the Christmas programme, expressed his deep gratitude to Bhagavan for His permission and guidance for Christmas celebrations at Prasanthi Nilayam. He also thanked the Ashram staff, Western Canteen staff and other devotees who helped in various ways in celebrating this holy function on a grand scale. Thereafter, Sri Behner introduced the four speakers who were blessed by Bhagavan to share their thoughts with the devotees on this occasion. The first speaker, Smt. Ines Christina Redini Letonico, from Argentina, dwelt on the significance of surrender and remarked that peace and happiness in life was possible only by complete surrender to the Will of God. The second speaker was Sri Sumeet Tappoo, a renowned singer from Fiji. Beginning his speech with a prayer song in his melodious voice, Sri Tappoo observed that it was a great good fortune of the contemporaries of Bhagavan that they had the opportunity to experience His Divinity. The third speaker of the afternoon was Smt. Poppy Hillcoat of Australia. Smt. Hillcoat narrated many experiences of celebrating Christmas at Prasanthi Nilayam in close proximity of Bhagavan and observed that both Jesus

and Bhagavan emphasised the importance of love in the life of man. While Jesus said "Love thy neighbour as thy self", Bhagavan is teaching "Love All, Serve All," she added. The last speaker who shared his thoughts with devotees was Dr. Michael Congleton, Regional Coordinator of Sathya Sai Organisation of South Pacific Region of the U.S.A. Talking about the medical camps conducted in California and other places, Dr. Congleton observed that service to mankind was the highest spiritual practice. He emphasised the need for practising human values while serving others and dwelt on the need for spiritual discipline in the life of man. After this speech, the day's proceedings concluded with Arati to Bhagavan at 6.30 p.m.

On 26th December, Bhagavan came to Sai Kulwant Hall at 4.45 p.m. The programme began at 5.00 p.m. with a brief speech of Prof. M. Veerabhadraiah, a faculty member of Sri Sathya Sai University. Dwelling on the universality of the teachings of Jesus and Bhagavan, the learned speaker observed that both of them give the message of love to mankind irrespective of any differences of religion, race and nationality. After this, Bhagavan showered His love and blessings on the assembled devotees by giving a nectarine Discourse. Bhagavan observed that God and love were synonymous terms and added that all the conflicts and differences which afflicted mankind today were the result of lack of love in the heart of man. (Full text of Bhagavan's Discourse has been given elsewhere in this issue.) The day's programme concluded with Bhagavan's Discourse. At 6.40 p.m. Bhagavan accepted Arati and left for His abode.

Christmas celebrations continued on 27th December also. The programme on 27th December comprised two items, a drama "The

Embodiments of Love!



The Real Meaning of Atma is Love

The world is the creation of God. Right from man, all living beings including animals, birds and even insects are the creation of God. As they are the creation of God, all of them have their origin in bliss. God is the source of all

Whatever good or bad you experience is the result of your own feelings. Everything comes from within you. Hence, you should always remain immersed in love. If you have love, you can achieve anything and perform any task. It is love that is responsible for the entire creation and its functioning in this world. There is no greater God than love. Love is God. Whatever you do without love is merely a futile exercise. Hence, treasure love in your heart.

bliss. Brahmanandam, Parama Sukhadam, Kevalam Jnanamurtim. Dwandwateetam. Gagana Sadrisham, Tattwamasyadi Lakshyam, Ekam, Nityam, Vimalam, Achalam, Sarvadhee Sakshibhutam (He is the embodiment of divine bliss, wisdom absolute, beyond the pair of opposites, expansive and pervasive like the sky, the goal indicated by the Mahavakya Tattwamasi, one without a second, eternal, pure, unchanging, witness of all functions of the intellect).



All these difficulties and troubles are only the imagination of man. There cannot be happiness without difficulties. *Pleasure is an interval between two pains*. These difficulties are meant to give you happiness, and not to make you miserable with more sorrows. Hence, whatever comes to you, consider it as God's gift and be happy. Do not consider that it has been given to you for your suffering. Suppose you have pain in the stomach, what will the doctor do? If he performs the operation, it is not for causing pain to you. The pain that the doctor gives is to remove your suffering. Hence, consider difficulties as the means of eradicating your sufferings.

There are millions of living beings in this world. All of them have originated from God. Therefore, the same God is present in all of them. People give many names to God as Rama, Allah, Jesus, etc., but God is only one. Atma is another name of God; it is the same in everyone. The real name of Atma is love. Love is only one, but it is present everywhere and can alleviate all sufferings. One who is endowed with love is free from all sufferings. All of you have come from such a distant place like America. What for? You have come because you have love for Me (loud applause). You can attain anything if you have love. God has no specific name. He is present in man in the form of Atma. What does Atma mean? It means love only. It is love that unites all. If you imbibe this principle of unity, then all will become one. When you attain this unity, you will have purity. When you have purity, then Atma Tattwa (principle of the Self) will manifest in you. Therefore, you must have unity to attain divinity. I and you are one. God and you are one. God is not anywhere distant from you. You should develop the conviction that you yourself are God.

Spiritual Practices without Love have no Value

When you say, 'I', it represents unity. You cannot estimate the bliss that is derived from unity. All are one. The fickle mind of man is unsteady and wanders arbitrarily. Only one thing is steady. That is love, love, love. This is what we have to learn today. The same love is present in everyone. All are the children of God. Therefore, God loves all. He has no hatred. He is not the cause for your pain and suffering. God is not separate from you. Wherever you may be, God is present there. God does not forsake you. There is no place where there is no God. You are all the embodiments of God. You have two eyes but you can see a large number of people with them. Similarly, God is one, but He can see all. Where is God? He is in you, with you, above you and below you. There is no need to search for Him. Because our vision is limited to physical level, we see differences. We should not rely on the physical body. Body is like a water bubble; mind is like a mad monkey. In one moment, the mind is here and in the next, it flies away to another place. Manas, Buddhi, Chitta, Ahamkara (mind, intellect, mind-stuff, ego) are all temporary like passing clouds. Only one thing is permanent. That is you. You should develop the feeling that you yourself are God.

You may perform any number of spiritual practices like Bhajans, Japa (chanting of God's Name) and Tapa (penance), but love should form the undercurrent of all these practices. In fact, if you have love, there is no need to perform any spiritual practice. There is no use of performing spiritual practices if you do not have love. Fill your heart with love. "Prema Mudita Manase Kaho Rama Rama

Ram..." (recite the Name of

Rama with your heart full of love). Give highest importance to love. Love is God. Live in love. This is the spiritual practice that you have to undertake. Worldly relations are temporary. They are impermanent like passing clouds which come and go. They are your mental reaction, reflection and resound.

(Swami showing His handkerchief) What is this? This is a cloth. It is not merely a cloth, it is a combination of threads. It is not a combination of threads even; it is cotton, which is the creation of God. Everything has emerged from God like threads from cotton. You weave the threads as per your liking. But it is not your liking that is important; what is important is what God likes. There can be changes in the body and the mind. But love is changeless. It is permanent. Everything has birth and death but there is no birth or death for love. The birthless and deathless love is only one. It comes from truth. Truth is one. Truth is God. God in the form of love is present everywhere, wherever you see.

There is no Greater God than Love

God is manifest in the breath of man. When you breathe, where does the breath come from? It comes from within you. The breath itself is God. What is its form? It is present in man in the form of Soham, which reveals man's divine identity. 'So' means 'that', 'Ham' means 'I'. Therefore, 'Soham' means 'That I am'. 'That' refers to God. God is present in man in the form of love. Therefore, man should treasure love in his heart safely. Other thoughts come and go like passing clouds. Only love is permanent and eternal. You should perform every task with love. Even if you come across your enemy, you should lovingly greet him, saying 'hello, hello'. Then he will also respond, saying 'hello, hello'



But, in fact, everything is love. Love is changeless. You should always remain filled with such love. If you follow this principle of love, it will give you the fruit of all the spiritual practices.

People call God by many names such as Rama, Krishna, Jesus, Allah, etc. But all names refer to the same God. If you call Him Allah, He will respond. Similarly, if you call Him Jesus, Zoroastra or Rama, He will respond. All these names have been given by man. God is not born with these names. The original name of God is love. You may refer

to any dictionary; love is only one and not two. Man may have many physical relationships. You may consider someone as your husband/wife, someone as your son and someone as your daughter. They are all physical and worldly relations. Who has established these relationships? It is you only. Since these are relationships acquired by you, they are subject to change. But love remains the same. With such love, you may chant any name such as Rama, Krishna, Govinda, Narayana, Jesus or Allah. All these names refer to the same God. You may grind rice and prepare various dishes such as Dosa, Idli, etc. You may mix rice with sugar and prepare Payasam (sweet pudding). But rice is the same in all these preparations. In the same way, only one God is present in the entire creation, and that is love. Therefore, you should perform each and every task with love.

Love is the True Form of God

We address others as 'brothers and sisters'. At physical level, they may appear to be separate. Brothers, sisters and all other relationships are one. These relationships are of your own making. But never observe diversity. You may see an old man and a child, but both of them are essentially divine. God is beyond all ages and all forms. Only love is His true form. The

same love is present in all forms that you see. Hence, everyone of you should develop love. You may call God as Rama, Krishna or Sai. But it is only a difference in names. God is only one. Love everyone wholeheartedly. Then only can you experience bliss. So long as you have love, you will not be devoid of bliss.

People today observe individual differences. You are not one but three: the one you think you are, the one others think you are, the one you really are. At physical level, you may be identified with

your name, form and village. But in reality, you are divine. This is what you should realise. Recognise the unity of the entire creation. Your worldly relations will also have some value when you recognise this unity. You may add any number of zeroes to 1, the value will go on increasing. If you remove 1, there is no value. That which imparts value to everything is God. Ekam Sath Viprah Bahudha Vadanthi (truth is one, but the wise refer to it by various names). The Vedas authenticate the same truth. With love in your heart, you may go to any country, chant any name, perform any spiritual practice. Do not hate anybody. Help Ever, Hurt Never. This is what the devotees are supposed to do (loud applause). When you call yourself a devotee, you should not observe any differences like "you are not mine, he is mine." This is not good. If you hate anyone, it amounts to hating God. You should think "God is in me, with me, around me, above me and below me." Wherever you see, the same God is present there. Develop this feeling of oneness. Then you will attain highest bliss.

Develop the Feelings of Oneness

You have come from different countries and you have different names and forms. But having come here, you are all one (*loud applause*). From today onwards, may you always remain in bliss for ever and ever! People say, "Today is my birthday." What is the meaning of birthday? It is the day of the birth of the body. Today it is born, tomorrow it may die. But you are eternal. You have no

birth, no death. Be always happy. This is what I desire. Do not allow the differences of mine and thine come near you. All of you have sung the glories of the Lord in one voice. This unity is divinity. Where there is lack of unity, there is diversity. Hence, develop unity. Where there is unity, there is purity. It is purity that attracts God. The white dress that you have put on symbolises purity. Differences are seen when you put on dresses of different colours. You should not give room to differences. Not only in dress, you should observe unity and purity in your mind, feelings and thoughts. All are one. On returning to your respective places, lead your lives with unity, love and bliss. Your Bhajan has made Me happy.

(Bhagavan sang the Bhajan "Hari Bhajan Bina Sukha Santhi Nahin ..." and continued His Discourse.)

Consider Bhajan as your Bhojan (food) which satiates your spiritual hunger. You should partake of the food of Bhajan every moment, day in and day out. Right from morning till night, you should constantly do Bhajan till you have life principle in you. This is Swami's teaching. Perform all your tasks while contemplating on the name of God within you. God is within you, without you, beyond you, below you and behind you. Very happy.

NEWS FROM SAI CENTRES

RUSSIA

ROM 1ST TO 8TH JULY 2007, 184 Sai volunteers from 14 countries including United Kingdom Germany held a medical camp in the town of Lodeynoye Polye near the historic city of St. Petersburg. They rendered selfless service with love to 2,970 patients at the medical camp. The medical team also visited five neighbouring towns to serve the needy. Patients with different ailments were given the best medication and advice with utmost care and love. The dental team performed major procedures. In addition to the medical work, Sai volunteers carried out renovations of a nearby orphanage, school and children's home. New toilets were built for the school and old furniture was repaired and painted. The classrooms, corridors and toilets were cleaned and scrubbed.

The medical camp volunteers and all devotees were blessed by Bhagavan's miracle and a tragedy was averted. Russian devotees travelled about 1,600 km in coaches and vans to greet the medical team. As they were driving overnight, one of the van occupants heard a strong inner voice urging her to chant Sai Gayatri. At that moment, the van skidded in the rain-drenched road and rolled over three times while the devotee chanted Sai Gayatri. With Bhagavan's grace, not one of the eight occupants of the van had a bruise or scratch on them. Many camp participants, Russian Sai devotees and patients shed tears of joy and gratitude for the grace of God that they received and the love they were able to give to others.

U. S. A.

The Sathya Sai Baba Organisation of America conducted a medical camp in St. Louis, Missouri at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church on 13th October 2007. A total of 333 patients were seen by 21 physicians and 136 volunteers at the medical camp. A unique feature of this camp was a bone marrow drive.

A unique feature of this camp was bone marrow drive, as a result of which 45 persons including the Chief Executive of St. Louis County registered as bone marrow donors.

Bone marrow transplant for blood cancers requires bone marrow donors. The National Bone Marrow Donor Programme identified a great need for the bone marrow donors from ethnic minority groups. Since the genetic traits for a marrow transplant are inherited, the likelihood of obtaining a match is highest within an ethnic group. This will help save lives of patients suffering from blood cancers. The medical camp screened potential donors and obtained

relevant genetic information through a mouth swab. All camp attendees were encouraged to register for the bone marrow programme. A total of 45 attendees including the Chief Executive of St. Louis County registered as marrow donors. The remainder of the medical camp consisted of health screening and health education including tests for blood glucose, hypertension, cholesterol, dental hygiene, obesity, mammograms, osteoporosis and hearing. In addition, free reading glasses were handed out as needed, bicycle helmets were given to children and car seats to infants. Children were given a complete physical by two paediatricians. The video entitled 'His Work', showing Bhagavan's magnanimous humanitarian projects was continuously screened during the camp. Distinguished guests included Charlie A. Dooley, County Executive, Lewis E. Reed, President, and Melba Moore, Health Commissioner of St. Louis City.

From 1st to 3rd September 2007, a regional retreat was held at Camp Henry Horner in Ingleside, Illinois. The theme of the retreat was "Feeling the Presence of God – Living in Loving Service". As part of the retreat, a free medical camp was conducted. During the camp, 89 patients were screened for hypertension, diabetes and cholesterol abnormalities. Health education was provided on nutrition, exercise, heart disease, stroke and cancer. Several of the participants diagnosed for the first time at the health screening had abnormal findings with their blood pressure and / or blood tests. These patients were referred to appropriate facilities for further treatment. The camp also provided continuity of care for those screened in the past.

MEXICO

Tabasco and Chiapas are agricultural states located in the Gulf of Mexico. Over a million people were left homeless after torrential rains and floods, which lasted for more than a week in October. A medical camp was held immediately following the disaster

in the village of Villahermosa from 9th to 11th November 2007. Local government officials welcomed a team of Sai devotees including physicians and support personnel at the airport and escorted them to the camp site where the Municipal President greeted them. During the three-day medical camp, 445 patients were seen and treated, specially for acute waterborne illnesses. In addition, preventive health measures and health education was provided. The people including government officials were deeply moved and grateful for the loving selfless service rendered by the team of volunteers from Sathya Sai

Organisation.

BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

On 23rd October 2007, the Bosniak Institute, a renowned cultural centre located in Sarajevo, hosted an interreligious meeting titled "Face to Face" which discussed common spiritual basis

They also gave new clothes and blankets to selected 65 poor people on that day. The district conducted an orthopaedic medical camp at Madhira town in which 450 patients were examined and given medicines. The district gave Amrutha Kalasams (food provisions for one month) to 64 selected families in Satyanarayanapuram village.

Vizianagaram district conducted a free medical camp in Gangada village on 2nd October 2007, treating 500 patients and examining 182 children. All were given free medicines. The district conducted a medical camp at Tekkali, treating 235 patients and carried out blood grouping for 185 people on 14th October 2007. The district opened a Women's Old Age Home in Laxmipuram village on 28th October 2007.



M. Tech. (Applied Optics): A First class (60% and above) both in the first degree and M.Sc. (Physics)/B.E./B. Tech. levels of examination with a background in Optics and Electromagnetic Theory.

Note: Eligible candidates will be short-listed by the University based on the marks of qualifying examinations. Only such candidates will be called for Admission Test.

In the case of candidates who have not received the marks statements of the final year of the first degree examination, their marks in the previous years/semesters should not be less than 60% in aggregate and 50% in General English. They should have taken their final year/semester qualifying examination before the date of the admission test.

Admissions are made as per the guidelines issued by the Govt. of India and UGC with regard to Reservation of seats. Candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes are entitled to a relaxation of 5% marks.
